**Indoor Dog Park Rules & Registration Form**

**Playgroup Rules**

- We must have written proof of current vaccinations on file in order for your dog to participate in playgroup (Rabies after 12 weeks of age, Distemper Combo, Bordatella).
- We must have a signed waiver, assumption of risk and agreement to hold harmless on file in order for your dog to participate in playgroup.
- Permission to play is at the discretion of the playgroup supervisor for each session (visit). We reserve the right to dismiss any dog permanently for any reason.
- Aggressive dogs are not permitted on the premises. Dogs must be removed at the first sign of aggression.
- Please do not bring your dog if it is exhibiting any of the following behaviors:
  - Coughing
  - Excessive sneezing
  - Runny nose or runny eyes
  - Vomiting
  - Diarrhea
  - Unusually lethargic behavior

If a staff member notices any of these symptoms, the dog will be excused immediately.

- Owners must stay with their dogs in the playroom the entire time the dog is here.
- Children 8 years and under are not allowed in the off-leash dog area; children ages 9 - 15 years must be accompanied by an adult.
- It is your responsibility to clean up after your dog. We will provide mops, buckets, poop-scoopers, etc.
- All dogs must have collars, For the safety of your dog(s) and other park visitors, choke, prong (pinch) and spike collars are strictly prohibited.
- All dogs must enter and exit the building on a leash.
- Female dogs in heat are prohibited.
- Food and drinks in glass containers are prohibited; training treats are allowed.
- Owners/custodians of a dog are responsible for the acts and conduct of their animal at all times when it at the indoor dog park. Dog park users and dog owners assume all risks related to use of the dog parks.
- Handler is limited to a maximum of three dogs.
- Quickly move away from the entrance area as you enter. That will help disperse the group of dogs that will come over to welcome your dog to the park. Move away from the fence so that your dog will not feel cornered or threatened. This will lessen the problem caused when several off leash dogs, already in the park, come running over to greet the new arrival, perhaps overwhelming the arriving dog.
- Keep your head on a swivel at all times as there will likely be groups of dogs running around the park and having fun. People standing around are obstructions. A dog being chased may try to run its pursuer into a person in order to gain an advantage. Stay alert!
- Owners must quiet dogs that bark, howl, or whine excessively.

Please remove all **extra** collars and leashes BEFORE entering playgroup. Under no circumstances are dogs to be leashed while in the play area without prior permission of playgroup supervisor. This is for safety reasons, as restraint may lead to fights.

Please take care to make sure dogs don't escape out of the play area as you enter. Announce your presence and intention to come in; others can hold their dogs for a moment. Always check that the gate or door is secured behind you.

Close all gates and doors behind you as you come to them in the building, or leave them open or closed as you found them when you entered.

You may want to make sure to wear clothes that you don't mind get dirty or torn. Also, hanging jewelry and scarves pose a potential hazard, especially large hoop earrings. We are not responsible for damage or loss.

We suggest you leave anything you don't need in the car. We are not responsible for loss or damage.
